For styling:

-  **Color Palettes & Patterns (Background Image)** <http://www.colourlovers.com/>
 - ✓ Search for a palette color scheme you like, click the palette (scroll down to see hex codes for colors)
 - ✓ Directly above the palette should be Create Pattern
 - ✓ Click Create Pattern, browse pattern styles or use drop down fields to select a pattern using your chosen palette
 - ✓ Right click on the desired pattern and hit View Image Background – right click and hit Save Image As... (Firefox)
Does not work well in Chrome/Edge
